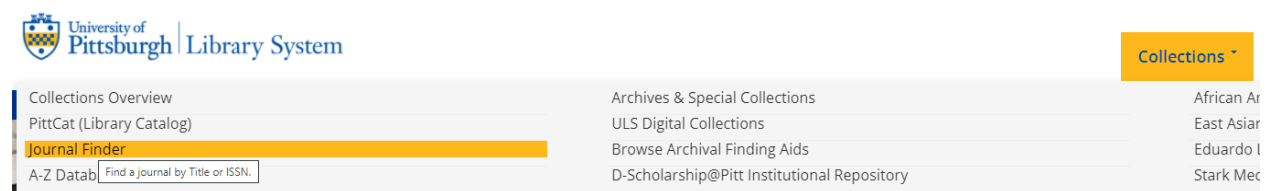


Journal Finder

Welcome to the Pitt Libraries Ask Us Series. In this video you will learn how to identify and discover magazines, journals, and newspapers that are available through Pitt Libraries by using Journal Finder.

The Pitt Libraries subscribe to many publications which are all inventoried in our Journal Finder tool. If you ever have a citation for an article and need to determine how to get it or you'd like to browse a particular publication based on date or volume, the Journal Finder is the place to start.

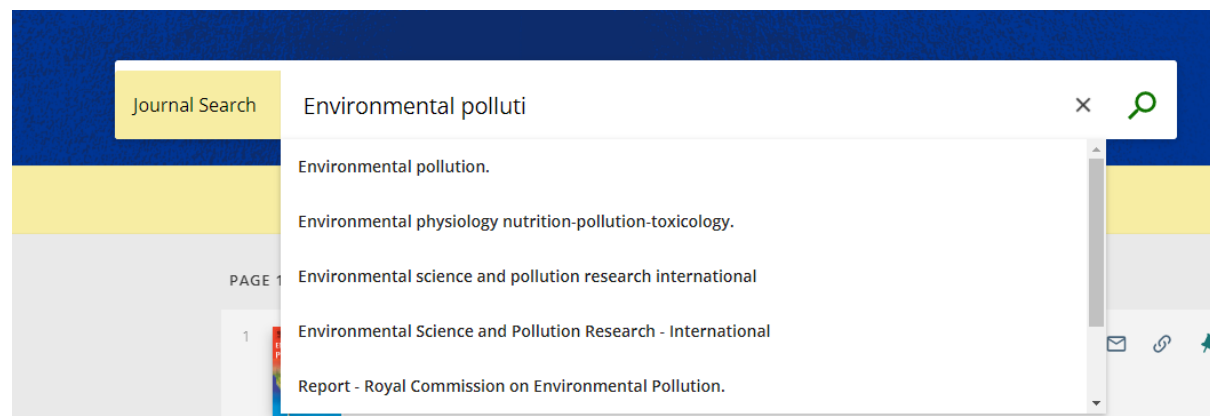
As always, start at the library's web site: library.pitt.edu and select the "Collections" tab in order to access Journal Finder.



Example Citation:

Mendrik, F. (January 2021). Species-specific impact of microplastics on coral physiology. *Environmental Pollution*, Vol.269, p.116238

The title of the journal, (*Environmental Pollution*), is the information from the citation that will be most helpful as you begin. The first step is to search for that journal title within Journal Finder and, if Pitt Libraries are a subscriber, you'll see the title pop-up in the search results.



Click on the title of the journal to see the detailed record for the publication in PittCat.

This is a good point to sign-in through Pitt Passport so that it's possible to access any full-text of the publication that might be available online or directly make a request for a scan from the library's print holdings.

When the details provided indicate the full-text is available, click the link to see if the article from the correct volume and issue [volume 269 (January 2021)] is among the content provided.

As you click through the prompts from the journal publisher's web site, you will ultimately drill down to the full-text article or PDF. From there, feel free to read online or download the article directly. You may also access the article in context, so you have the option to see other articles or content from that same issue or volume from that journal.

You now know how to access and search Journal Finder to gain access to publications the Pitt Libraries subscribe to. It is a helpful tool when you have a citation for an article that you want to find or to browse the contents of a particular publication.
